As members of the Episcopal branch of the Jesus movement, the Episcopal Diocese of Louisiana is committed to healing and wholeness for all of God's people. To this end, we have faithfully engaged in racial healing work through Dismantling Racism Trainings. In 2020, the Commission for Racial Healing set our main priority as hosting these trainings for the people of our diocese and our surrounding communities. We are proud to report that the past two years, the Commission for Racial Healing has hosted four virtual Dismantling Racism Training sessions and follow up sessions, as well as four in person trainings around the diocese. A total of 108 individuals have attended and completed the course, 32 clergy and 76 lay. Our primary focus will continue to be education and we are looking to expand our work through experiences and partnerships throughout our diocese.
