As Jesus said, "which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, saying, 'This fellow began to build and was not able to finish.'(Lk 14:26-30)"

Without a clear understanding of the financial foundation of a congregation, it is nearly impossible to discern where the future lies.
