On the Horizon: Ministry "Field Trips"

As a chaplain and teacher for many years at Episcopal School of Baton Rouge, I learned that experiential learning augments book learning by a factor of many. For instance, in high school ethics, students would study the philosophy of justice, but we would also visit a courtroom, a police station, a prison. We would study the causes of crime, but we would also visit a mental health facility and an addiction treatment clinic. In field trips such as these, abstract notions of justice and injustice, evil and good, came to life.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if each deacon could share the sights, sounds and smells, the challenges and joys, of his or her ministry in the world with the rest of us deacons, as well as with priests and with lay folks? We have so much to learn from each other about Christ-like service that we can then take back into our respective congregations.

Deacon Mike Hackett is now working with prison officials to offer deacons a tour of Louisiana's largest prison, the Louisiana State Penitentiary at Angola, and the chance to learn about the work of the Episcopalians who minister there. I'm hoping this will be the first of many "field trips" to come. Let Mike know if you want to go, and be thinking about how you can share your ministry with us.




Highlights from the Spring Deacons Conference






