# **Blessed Frances Joseph Gaudet Fund Report 2023**

"The early impressions upon youths are always lasting. Good environment is invaluable to the development of body and mind. . . . It has greater influence over children, because a child's mind is fresh, receptive and retentive. Few plants can thrive and reach maturity surrounded by weeds. One or the other must suffer."

Blessed Frances Joseph Gaudet

Episcopal Community Services of Louisiana (ECSLA) is a social service agency of the Episcopal Diocese of Louisiana that honors the legacy of Blessed Frances Joseph Gaudet, a turn-of-the century educator and activist. The agency's current activities are coordinated by the Gaudet Fund Committee comprised of the Bishop and members appointed from across the diocese. The committee stewards the Gaudet fund that awards annual scholarships to African-American students of Episcopal schools in our Diocese, and offers grants to community organizations within the geography of the Diocese that primarily serve the needs of African-American children.

Blessed Frances earned a national reputation in her life as a prison reformer, educator, and missionary. She was a driving force behind the establishment of the first juvenile court in New Orleans. Blessed Frances, who was connected to St. Luke's Episcopal Church in New Orleans, the historic African-American parish of our Diocese, is honored in the calendar of The Episcopal Church on Dec. 31. She continues to serve as an inspiring example for lay ministers across The Episcopal Church, and her ministry is ongoing through the legacy of her namesake fund.

#### The Fund

The value of the Gaudet Fund at the end of fiscal year 2022 was approximately \$4.6 million. Currently, the annual draw on the fund value is 4.6% of a rolling three-year average. The committee reevaluates the percentage annually, and has been more inclined in recent years to prioritize grant requests directly aligned with Blessed Frances's passion for criminal justice reform and environmental based education.

### Scholarships

Through the Gaudet Fund, ECSLA offers need-based Scholarships to pre-k through 12<sup>th</sup> grade African-American students of Episcopal schools in The Episcopal Diocese of Louisiana. In 2023, ECSLA and the Gaudet Fund were proud to award \$112,021 in scholarships, representing 47% of the fund's annual investment income.

## Grants

ECS intends the grants awarded by the Gaudet Fund to support not-for-profit agencies that create, manage, and expand educational opportunities for African-American children within the boundaries of the Diocese of Louisiana. All not-for-profit agencies are eligible to apply. The grant awards totaling \$126,940 for 2023 represent 53% of the fund's annual investment income.
